PURPOSE OF THE COMMUNITY IMPACT SAFETY NET COMMITTEE:

To review and evaluate information including Funding Proposals and related details submitted by non-profit United Way Program Providers seeking safety net allocation funds. To recommend to the Governing Board of United Way of Amarillo & Canyon the amount of program funding to be allocated to those Program Providers which will, in turn, provide essential human services to Amarillo and Canyon citizens.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP:

- ◆ Is a resident of, own business in and/or employed in geographic area served by United Way of Amarillo & Canyon (Potter /Randall Cos.)
- ◆ Is a contributor to United Way of Amarillo & Canyon.
- ◆ Required to identify any relationship(s) with Program Providers under review for allocation funding. Any association must be disclosed on the Conflict of Interest form for the information of other Community Impact Council members, Provider staff, and United Way of Amarillo & Canyon staff and board members.
- ◆ No member may serve for more than four (4) consecutive years on any one team.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- ◆ Attend orientation training.
- ◆ Attend agency site visits of all programs that are reviewed by assigned team.
- ◆ Develop understanding of the evaluation form and process of ranking programs.
- ◆ Become educated on tools for program evaluation, including Outcome Measurement.
- ◆ Evaluate the program conditions and performance of agencies requesting funding.
- ◆ Request additional information from the agencies when deemed necessary.
- ◆ Attend program Question & Answer meetings with agency staff and volunteers.
- ◆ Recommend to the Governing Board of United Way of Amarillo & Canyon suggested allocation of funds for Program Provider services.
